One of the most important things to understand about our system is that it is based on the conviction that the spinal column is the life line of our body structure, upon which our mental and physical state of well-being depends. The stronger the backbone, the firmer the muscle tone surrounding the lower back, and the more perfectly the spinal column is aligned, the healthier we are. Therefore, we are more able to function normally and efficiently in all our daily activities, whether we work, swim, play tennis, golf, ski o walk. A weak and underdeveloped spine creates bad posture and the entire body acts like a "broken-down machine" ready to fall apart. All the important parts of the body, bone, muscles, joints, nerves, and all vital organs, are cramped into inactivity and become sluggish and practically lifeless. Is there any wonder that backaches are so prevalent? Conversely, a healthy, strong and well-developed spine creates good posture and makes one feel alive, alert, and full of energy and youthful vitality. Because the spinal column is so instrumental in the achievement of good health and perfect posture, it is important that you understand first its basic structure before you learn about the inherent weaknesses that cause back problems.
